Nomination letters should be sent by the National Committee Chairs and Secretaries together with a CV of the proposed person to the IPS Secretariat, ips (at) peatlands. Note that all applications need to contain the position(s) aimed at, in descending order. We would like to highlight that in the Executive Board, the traditional balance between industry and science should be safeguarded as far as possible. In addition, diverse backgrounds, personal characteristics and cultures are appreciated. Executive Board members should be able to pay their own travel costs, if not otherwise agreed beforehand. #### €16 Million Moorland Project in the UK launched

A €16 million project that will help protect and transform moorlands across the South Pennines and the Peak District National Park has been officially launched by UK Environment Minister Rory Stewart. The five-year project, hosted by the Peak District National Park Authority, will enable the team at Moors for the Future to continue the progress that has been made over the past 12 years, protecting huge areas of the internationally important South Pennine Moors. The funding for MoorLIFE 2020 includes €12 million from the EU's LIFE fund, as well as significant contributions from three major utility companies, Severn Trent Water, United Utilities and Yorkshire Water. The funding will enable the partnership to expand its work hugely, protecting the integrity of 9,500 hectares of active blanket bog through revegetating bare peat, improving hydrology and diversifying existing vegetation. # Progress towards Aichi Biodiversity Targets

The 20th meeting of the Subsidiary Body on Scientific, Technical and Technological Advice (SBSTTA 20) of the Convention on Biological Diversity (CBD) came to a close on **30 April** with the adoption of a number of key recommendations that provide the scientific basis for enhanced implementation of the Strategic Plan for Biodiversity 2011 - 2020 and achievement of its Aichi Biodiversity Targets. Parties agreed e.g. to a short-term action plan to promote restoration of natural and semi-natural ecosystems as a contribution to halting biodiversity loss, improving ecosystem resilience, enhancing the provision of ecosystem services, mitigating and adapting to the effects of climate change, combating desertification and land degradation, and improving human well-being while reducing environmental risks and scarcities. Parties are encouraged to use a variety of approaches, according to national circumstances, including quantitative indicators, expert opinion, stakeholder consultation and case studies and clear documentation.
